Mr. Williams stated that sponsorship opportunities are in the works, a tad bit late however, an update will be provided as items are completed.

Safety Service Director Brubaker:

Mr. Brubaker provided kudos to Sanitation worker Purvie Smallwood, who helped with the assistance of placing a rescue call for a resident that was injured in her yard on Hilliard during his sanitation route. Also kudos to Firefighter Nick Pshock for work on a software system called crew sense.

SSD Brubaker also provided an update from a February E.P.A. recycle grant for a truck and chipper, the grant was awarded.

Assistant Chief Joe Pronesti has been placed as interim Fire Chief until December 31, 2021. He will take the fire exam assessment in September or October 2020. Mr. Brubaker congratulated Chief Pronesti, as well as expressed his appreciation for Assistant Chief Gall who filled in during this transition.

President Stewart congratulated Chief Pronesti and expressed his appreciation for Assistant Chief Gall.

Law director Deery asked that council consider adjourning into executive session to discuss the matter of pending litigation. Attorney Brian Balzer is in attendance to provide an update to council regarding some matters.

Fire Chief Pronesti:

Comments provided by Chief Pronesti regarding exception reporting.

Mr. Oswald directed a question to either the Police or SSD regarding the fence around the Police Department parking lot. SSD Brubaker responded that the project is delayed due to manufacturing product delays. He was hopeful that the project could have been completed by the middle of this month, however they are waiting on the fencing and the decorative fencing.

ASSD Calvert:

ASSD Calvert provided a reminder that the State of Ohio generously funded some Covid-19 resources for small business and funding is still available. Up to thirty thousand dollars for food and beverage establishments, entertainments venues as well lodging. Up to ten thousand dollars if the small business was started January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020. Grants are available to offset decreased revenues as a result of Covid-19.

Engineer Schneider explained that Friday, July 31, 2020, Governor Mike DeWine's office announced approval of a water and wastewater infrastructure grant. The grant monies are first come, first serve. Mr. Schneider submitted a referral to the council clerk's office from the floor. Mr. Schneider also provided and update on th street resurfacing, due to weather delays in other communities, it has caused a delay for our city as well. The contractor I anticipating starting later this month with the street resurfacing.

Mr. Oswald inquired about the resurfacing of Burns and Gulf Roads, considering the funding sources were different from the resurfacing project. Mr. Schneider explained the funding was not received until July, the Engineering department is in the process of bidding the projects out so that they can move forward.

HR Director Yousefi:

Director Yousefi shared that a leadership program is being designed for forty-three managers and supervisors that consist of seven to ten sessions of programming to include professional trainers such as Melvin Smith (Case Western Reserve University Professor/ Author). Some topics covered will include, Emotional Intelligence, Leadership and Management Assessments, Effective Practices for high Performance Teams, Strategic Leadership, Legal Compliance. The plan is a start date of October.

ASSD Dawn Calvert provided an overview and definition of what a CDC (Community Development Corporation) is and how they operate within communities. They have done a lot, however need to set up their 501c3 status. President Stewart asked to hear from the consultant Mr. Joel Ratner. Mr. Ratner is hopeful that by the end of the year a board will be established and that the 501c3 will be established as well. President Stewart explained that all information shared tonight, is traditionally discussed at committee meetings and not at a full council meeting, Mr. Oswald expressed his discontentment with the business being set up backyards in his opinion. He is hesitant in the decision to move forward due to not being in the loop going forward as things have been moving along with the CDC. Mr. Ratner accepted full responsibility for not providing monthly reports or updates and stated that he will provide efficient communication going further by way of written reports or attend meetings on a monthly basis to provide an oral monthly report. Mrs. Mitchell stated that she was in agreement with Mr. Oswald, the discussion held was committee work and committee work is not to be conducted on the council floor. She would like updates as well. One item of concern was if the CDC would be working with the local arts council. Mr. Ratner responded that yes, they have reached out to local non-profits, admittedly things did not go right in the beginning, however there is still time to make things right. Mr. Baird, stated that he has done research on Mr. Ratner. He believes that we should move forward, information was shared that council did not receive, however he does not believe that to be the fault of Mr. Ratner. President Stewart stated that he is in agreement with Mr. Oswald and Mrs. Mitchell and his greatest concern is what the contribution from the city will be to sustain the CDC. Mr. Ratner shared that the best example of a CDC that he can provide I Lakewood Alive. He suggest that the group visit them. The city dynamics are similar and the cdc has been around for seventeen years. Law Director Deery, expressed her concern that the initial grant dollars from Nord have been exhausted and that going forward would be coming out of the general fund. Mr. Ratner confirmed that to be accurate and that a proposal is pending with Nord Family Foundation and discussions are being had with Nordson and the Community Foundation of Lorain County and other philanthropic sources.

1389.01 WRITTEN APPROVAL TO CHANGE GRADE REQUIRED.

No person shall cause the grade of a lot in the City to be increased by filling, or decreased by excavation, so that the flow of water is altered from that existing before any filling or excavating without first securing written approval from the City Engineer. Such filling or excavating shall be done only to the extent recommended by the Engineer with such culverting, tiling or ditching as approved to provide necessary drainage. (Ord. 65-31. Passed 3-15-65.)

1389, 02 PERMIT APPLICATION; FEE; INSPECTION.

(a) If a person desires to make a change in the grade of any land in the City, he shall present to the City Engineer a written application requesting permission to make such change, enclosing therewith a plat of the land involved reflecting the elevations before and after the change in grade and shall set forth the method of collecting surface water so as to protect the adjacent property and the type of materials to be used and the methods by which the materials shall be used. A ten dollar (\$10.00) fee shall accompany such application.

Upon receipt of the application, the City Engineer shall view the premises and determine if the proposed change in grade provides for proper collection of surface water so as to protect the adjoining property. If the same is acceptable, he shall issue a written permit to the applicant. Upon completion of the change in grade of the premises involved, the applicant shall notify the Engineer in writing and the Engineer shall inspect the premises to determine if the change of grade has been performed consistent with the plans submitted to him.

Dear Mr. Shippy:

Please be advised that I and the other residents of Berkley Drive will need an extension of time, and further guidance and coordination in replacing our sanitary laterals.

In discussing the matter with the other affected residents one of our prime consideration was that in view of Council and the City's acceptance of responsibility for that portion of sanitary laterals on far curb lawns and under the street we wish to make certain that <u>our</u> repairs of our laterals, and the City's repairs of <u>our</u> laterals be conducted in such a manner that we will not be forced to suffer the expense and inconvenience of tearing up <u>our</u> lawns, shrubs, and street more than once.

Being complete neophytes in manners of this type we feel that - exofficio, the administration - through your office - should provide us with at
least five perspective qualified contractors so that we can attempt to establish
thorough and adequate parameters to put the matter out for bid, and permit you to
professionally coordinate and supervise \underline{all} sanitary lateral repairs to the extent
of adequacy of completion to the benefit of our street, the Fourth Ward, and the
City.

We residents of Berkley Drive understand the watertight integrity of sanitary laterals not to be just our problem: but a <u>city-wide</u> problem, and not just a concern of our street and our ward.

We see our street as the apparent paradigm for the remainder of the Fourth Ward and the City. We assume ourselves to be the beginning the administration and council's attempt to undertake the citywide upgrade of this portion of our aging city's infrastructure. We presume it to be the beginning of the undertaking of an ongoing city-wide program to correct a city wide problem - or we would not be subjected to it. And conversely: the administration and council would not have shown the consideration and forethought to make all of us able to afford it.

Dear Neighbor,

As you should be well aware by now there are no dedicated storm sewers on Berkley Drive. The residents of your property at one time saw fit to extemporize a storm sewer for themselves into my front yard. They had no legal grounds to do this. When the city went through and made us all remove our downspouts somewhere along the line the owners of your homes saw fit to reconnect yours into my property, or back into their footer drains. I am taking this opportunity to advise you that with the developments in the neighborhood I can no longer be gracious and afford you this luxury: I can no longer afford to maintain your property at the expense and detriment of my own. I hope that you appreciate that most people would have acted in their own pecuniary best interest years ago. Therefore, you certainly cannot fault me for taking this action now.

I will be disconnecting, and disableing your personal "storm sewer" where it flows into my property. I will be doing so before November 15th. If you have yard drainage, downspouts, or sump pumps, that are connected to this extemporized storm sewer it obviously would be to your advantage to disconnect and correct them, and in the case of sump pumps pit them.

As you know: because I had no choice, due to flooding, I had to dig up most of my house, rebuild a sizable portion of my basement walls, replace most of my footer tile, and instal a sump pump. The street drainage basin that is located in my front yard will no longer support the load that your properties are placing on it. I must drain my property first. My family and I have maintained this drainage since 1955 at our own expense and effort, and permitted you the luxury of its use. Hence forth: if the water from your property reaches my yard it will be on the surface of the ground. The city's mismanagement of expansion abutting Berkley from Overbook, and the inability of all of us to run our downspouts and yard surface surface water into the city's sanitary sewers has changed the surface water circumstances for us on Berkley Drive. I have already spent thousands of dollars.

For your information: I met with the Mayor Keys on at least one occasion when he was in office, and his city engineer on at least two occasions. On September 20th of this year I met with the city's Safety Service Director, and the new city engineer on my complaints about storm water drainage and property damage. I went to the city council meeting on October 1st and publicly demanded of the council that they take some action on my well documented disclosure of my problems starting in the mid 80's.

I tell you this so that you know that it is public knowledge that we have surface water problems on Berkley Drive, and to let you know well in advance what action I am taking in my own interest.

- 1.Reference the first paragraph of your letter: as my old college logic professor, Marion Tinsler, Ph.D., would say, "I think that you have an undifferentiated middle.""

 I.e. there are no storm sewers on Berkley Drive!
- 2. Therefore, if you do a dye test of the downspouts, and footer tile of \underline{all} the residences on Berkley Drive, you will find that they \underline{all} flow into the "sanitary laterals" of their residences.
- 3.I first brought this situation to the attention of the city on May 31, 1985, when I filed a formal complaint with the City Solicitor's office about a violation of Elyria City Ordinances 1389.01 and 1389.02, which was never been resolved.
- 4.0n January 22, 1987, I spoke with you (Mr. Shippy) in your office about the same problem again, and I'm certain that the Berkley Drive sewer situation was brought up. I also have a copy of in my files of a letter to Mr. Shippy dated May 6, 1987, requesting status on enforcement action on my formal complaint of May 31, 1985. I would assume that the sewer situation on Berkley Drive was again brought up, since the nature of my complaint was a request to get a neighbor to "restore the status quo ante" drainage wise to my property: that was perhaps reduced in value as a result of some major improvements that he made to his residence.

5.I too read the newspapers, and am well aware of the City's sewer problems, and I want to be a good citizen. In any complaints that I have had with the City, I have always conducted myself as "the typical reasonable and prudent man" always alluded to in common law, and I am continuing to do so.

6. Therefore, since the problems addressed in your letter are major improvements of a significant financial nature to one of my common means, unless His Honor, Mayor Keys, and the city, come down to Berkley Drive and dye test every residence, and "mandate" that a storm sewer be installed on the street, and that everyone on the street tie into it, I am not going to take any action without further clarification and coordination from your office.

7. The nut of the situation is this: I can barely see my way to spend this kind of money in present circumstances, can certainly afford to <u>only spend it once</u>, can't complain about the cost of being a good citizen, don't want to be the only one to dance to that proverbial tune, and don't want to have to make what we use to term in my days in the military "a repeat command performances" to comply with the city's strictures.

Fellow Berkley Residents,

I have 66 years on Berkley Road, and now I am formally Lam writing this letter to you and formally requesting that you join with me in asking the City of Elyria to construct a storm sewer on the south side of Berkley Road.

I have enclosed pictures of my drainage problems for you to look at. After the distribution of these pictures no one can state that our street does not have a major drainage problem. The problem is here and will persist as long as the street exists. When I turn this property over to the next owner he or she will be well advised of my efforts to cure the problem connected with it, and the adjoining properties. My actions have only mitigated the problem. No investor in this property would be self destructive enough to undo or ignore my actions to mitigate its problems and abrogate the property rights that come with owning 138 Berkley Drive. They would only be destroying their own investment.

At the time my parents acquired this property in 1954 it was done through "R.E. Bob Clawson." Bob and his wife Goldie lived at 125 Berkley, and looking through old directories probably knew my father since before WWII. We moved here from 241 East Eighth Street where my parents lived when I was born. Bob and Goldie moved to Arizona I believe in the late 50's. My parents visited Las Vegas and went to Arizona and visited with the Clawsons the summer before my father died. My father started in business on Cleveland Street early post WWII. There were no significant problems with this property or Bob would not have sold it to my parents: and had the problem of having them as a neighbor too. My father became well aware of the power of easements through his property dealings on Cleveland Street. People were always seeking one from him.

The drainage problems have been caused mainly by changes on 165 Overbrook. On property then owned by the Battin family who sold it to the Cooks. I was a friend to Mark Battin until he was in Junior High, and at that time I became well aware of the various aspects of that property. Battins built on the property, and the Cook's significantly so. I do not know the present owners. With the addition and improvements that the Cooks did the people of Berkley were inundated by surface water. Everyone from house number 166, the then Dall property, east to Gulf Road. By the late 70's the problem was extensive. When my mother took ill in the early 80's, I wondered if this property was even saleable as it was. There are disclosure laws connected with real property. I took over the property from my mother's estate in 1985 when my mother passed. I soon invested about \$11,000 dollars in the house by having all of its foundation that was exposed to the outside dug up, and all of the footer tile replaced, and a sump pump installed in a silo at the northwest corner of my house. Circumstances forced me to do this to keep the house from falling in and being washed away. I have custody of the street drain installed by my mailbox. My sump pump drains into it. That drain's outlet is only 6 inches in diameter all the way to the ravine which leads it to the Black River. It was put in when the street was put in by the street's developer or Elyria Township. It crosses under the street and drains into the ravine on 137. Berkley, the Becker property.

The ravine on the Becker property is the lowest point on Berkley Road, and was crafted by Mother Nature to drain all surface water form the cul-de-sac to the top of the street at Gulf Road. Mother Nature created it to to receive all of the surface drainage from this ravine's south, east, and west. The basic "lay-of-the-land" cannot be denied for drainage purposes. Water always runs downhill. The Becker property constitutes a public utility for drainage. The late Mr. Becker had the west wall of his basement replaced, and blocked the original outlet into the ravine by having the resulting rubble dumped onto it. If I remember he did this before moving into the house. I have a picture of the original outlet, and showed it to him to inform him of his error and problem.

The people to the west of me, house numbers 140 and 148, have improvised a storm drain for their own use onto my property to gain access to the six inch drain going to the ravine across the street. That is a street drain, and not a public storm sewer. I destroyed that private enterprise where it enters my property. It will never be replaced unless we residents get the City of Elyria to put in a storm sewer. The only way for those to the west of me to access my yard and the ravine across the street on the north side of the street is via the surface of the ground. In the past, and presently, they are managing their property as if they have a storm sewer. They do not have one. I have already spent legal fees against city action towards me for my action. Things will stay as they are. In essence: I took from my neighbors what they had at my expense, and did not legally have the right to use. They are now stuck as I am: with no storm sewer. Under no circumstances will there ever be a storm sewer on Berkley Road unless we residents agree to be accessed for it!

In fact: there are no easements recorded on my deed, and none on the deeds of the surrounding properties to grant any access to dump water into my property in any manner but via the surface of the ground. My actions were forced by my desire to protect my property and asset. Changes around me forced me. With my forewarning and this distribution of facts no future owner of my property would be dumb enough and self-destructive to change my actions. They would only add to their problems. Also, no one on Berkley Road can deny these drainage issues after I disseminate these facts and pictures.

In the last few years I spent in excess of \$12,000 to keep up my property by taking out a tree, removing a stump, and installing \$12,000 worth of drainage into the 6 inch drain in my front yard. To have permitted the status quo to continue would have been self destructive to me and my property. My parents did not acquire this property to enhance the lives of their neighbors, but to live in and raise their family. I am acting in extension of that effort as the present owner of 138 Berkley Road. When I succumb to age and pass the property on to another the problem will still be here. We need a storm sewer for all of our benefits. Everyone on the south side of the street has drainage issues, and I hereby am stating that without a storm sewer the property values on the street will only decline as the problem becomes more widely known throughout the community.

The past owners of the property to my west have not treated me well when I granted them access to my property. The people to my west even asked me if they could use my property to build onto their house. The property to my west was owned by Rusty and Vivian Atkinson when my folks bought the property. In about 1955 my father asked them why they bought it. He said it is built wrong. It is built to its edges. Full width of the lot with its semi-attached garage. It runs the width of the lot and is built to a few feet of its lot lines. It leaves no access to their property for maintenance. Someday someone will have to take down the garage and build a new garage towards the southwest corner of the lot. The homeowner will then be able to have access to their complete property and drain it. Akinsons moved to California within a couple years. The property to my west seems to change hands frequently as its problems and limitations become realized.

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
