Police Chief Whitely: No report

Fire Chief Pronesti:

Chief Pronesti shared that he is happy and ready to take on the new role. He and the fire department are here for whatever they can do for the City of Elyria. He is looking forward to working with everyone. Fire Chief Pronesti reported that there was another fatal fire in the city. The fire was very unfortunate. One of the lessons he would like for council to share with their constituents is to make sure that they check their smoke detectors. This latest fire was potentially preventable. He stated that it is a tragedy. The chief recommends checking smoke and carbon monoxide detectors during Fire Prevention Week. He shared that calls are still increasing. Mrs. Mitchell, congratulated Chief Pronesti, she stated that years ago the fire department distributed smoke detectors, is that practice still being done? Chief Pronesti responded that the union purchased several smoke detectors, he is not sure how many they may still have in stock. Resident can call Elyria Fire to inquire and council members can refer residents to Elyria fire regarding smoke detectors.

Mrs. Davis congratulated Chief Pronesti, she stated that she witnessed the most amazing thing, a helicopter landed at the fire station at Bell Ave. and route 57. Chief Pronesti explained that in the event of severe emergencies, pre-designed locations are determined for landing a helicopter. A specific coordinate or landing zone is provided. The exercise was an education in the helicopters for the fire department as well as familiarity in the landing space.

I am John Gall of 424 Augusta Drive, Elyria.

A21 is a global non-profit that focuses on human slavery and trafficking. The number of victims trapped in this modern-day slavery is 40.3 million according to the International Labor Organization. That number is more than the population of Canada. In America, you may not see the exploitation of labor or forced marriages. What you see here is the most common form of human trafficking, sexual exploitation.

Rene Stiles, a retired Elyria Police Dispatcher, organized the silent walk here in Elyria with her daughter Naomi. The Chronicle Telegram presented this event in Thursday's edition. This event highlighted what human trafficking is and that it happens here in Lorain County. There were nearly two dozen participants.

When a person is exploited for sex, by some measure of force, fraud, or coercion, it is human trafficking. When a person is seeking to purchase sex, that person does not know it the other party is being trafficked. They weigh the risk, knowing it is against the law, put faith that a condom will protect them from an STD, never considering the consequences. They think it is a victimless crime. It is not.

This describes my 3rd Ward Councilman, Mark Jessie, a perpetrator in the largest Human Trafficking sting in Ohio history, making the national news. This sting freed 16 adults and 10 children.

This council, in your weak response to your colleague, stating a "Stellar citizen in all ways," you are no more than a sock-puppet for all to see at a used car lot, with no backbone, initially siding with your colleague as though there was nothing to see here. Then, after being pummeled for your inaction, you put out a call for resignation in what Andy Young described as serving "Their interest in divorcing themselves from him and protecting power." You have never considered removing him from the committees he serves on. So much for your Watchdog bark. You have no teeth.

My councilman states "I will not be resigning" so it is now up to the voters. In essence, voters will have a decision to overlook an alleged but confessed human trafficker and say, "I am OK with this." I say to my neighbors in the 3rd Ward, do not support human trafficking. Do not allow this stain to continue.

Just like Achan's sin in the Book of Joshua, this city will have to answer.

After reviewing the submitted plans for the referenced project it is unable to be approved as submitted. The premises are zoned, Residential- Two Household (R-TH), the requirements of which are found in the Chapters 1137, and 1148 of the Flyria Codified Ordinances (ECO).

In particular, the plans show the need for the following variance(s):

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The structure has a proposed setback of 7' 6" from the rear vacated ordinance lot line and has a rear yard lot coverage of sixty (60) percent, which exceeds the forty (40) percent minimum allowed.

The structure is proposed to be located in the rear yard of the property on a corner lot twenty-two (22) feet from the property line. Front yard setbacks apply in this situation.

The structure has a proposed height of approximately eighteen (18) feet.

The proposed fence adjacent to Douglas St. has a height of six (6) feet, and twenty-two (22) feet from the property line. The proposed fence does not have the required spacing between planks.

Zoning Code Requirement

Accessory use, other than sign and fonce, shall be located in the rear yard and located not closer than three (3) feet from any lot line, six (6) feet from any alley and covering not more than forty (40) percent of the required rear yard.

The minimum front yard setback for properties in the R-TH residential two Household District shall be not less than thirty (30) feet.

No accessory structure shall exceed fiftgen (15) feet in height.

A front yard fence is a fence which is located within the required front yard. A front yard fence shall be no more than four (4) feet in Height and shall be open at least fifty (50) Percent of its projected area. The open space shall be evenly distributed (i.e.: chain link; picket with 2" board, 2" opening etc.).

AN OPDINANCE VACATING AN ALLEY ON SIXTEENTH STREET IN THE CITY OF SIXMA, OLDO. (Alley #3)
