### Mayor Whitfield:

Mayor Whitfield provided an update to the recent tragedies that ocurred in the city. One being a murder, suicide of an entire family. The other a recent shooting on Denison Ave. Mayor Whitfield stated that he is aware of a gun challenge, however Elyria Police are properly investigating every incident. Mayor Whitfield encouraged anyone that may be struggling with a mental health crisis to reach out to community resources.

# **Police Capt. Grooms:**

Captain Grooms provided appreciation on behalf of Chief Pelko for granting him the opportunity to travel for continuing education training. Two new police officers were recently hired in as transfers, one from Cleveland Police Department and the other from East Cleveland Police Department. Two cadets recently graduated as well, all four are currently in an orientation program. EPD will start a lateral transfer list for November. EPD was recently awarded a forty nine thousand dollar wellness grant. Twenty nine thousand dollars of the grant will be directed towards mental health, twenty thousand will be directed towards well-being. EPD in an effort to raise money to support other agencies, is running a No-shave November campaign. Donations will benefit St. Judes children's hospital. Captain Grooms shared that the although he was unable to share details of the recent tragedies in the city, the incident on Kennybrook Lane was heartbreaking regarding mental health. He explained that officers are being monitored as responding to situations can take a toll on their mental health as well. The incident on Denison is an active investigation. An update was provided in the death of Shane Edwards, arrests of both a 16 and 19 year old males were made in the murder of Shane Edwards.
