Safety Service Director Lundy:

SSD Lundy shared the administration would like to thank the voters of Elyria for their support of Issue eight. He further shared that in challenging economic times the support of issue eight affirms residents belief in support of the city's safety forces and to see the city continue to progress. Close to eighty high grass notifications have been sent out from the office of Safety Service. SSD Lundy expressed that new homeowners have eight days to address the issue of high grass or the city will cut the grass. The biggest challenge that exist has been rain. SSD Lundy reminded residents to please submit high grass complaints to the Safety Service Office. Council member Cerra asked for clarification of the notification term, wether it was eight days or five. SSD Lundy, confirmed an eight day notification. Council member Cerra stated he understood the notification to state eight inches, five days. He believed maybe he had miscommunicated the policy.

ASSD Williams requested if he could provide due diligence and report back on the specific purchase order in question.

Robert Abbott Jr.-618 N. Abbe Rd., Elyria- Problems at Midway Mall area, Cascade Park, N. Abbe manhole, Midway Diner, Ford Rd. Weed- Mr. Abbott had several issues of concern that were expressed. He previously spoke with a council member regarding a recycle container located near Midway Mall, the company name listed is paperretriever.com. The flap on the side of the bin is broken and has been for two years. The bin is full so papers are flying out of it. The Midway Diner has been dumping illegally for over a year and a homeless person is habitating in a shed in the back on the property. The cosmetic condition of the houses at the entrance of Cascade Park. Abbe Rd. Manhole covers. Ford Rd. High grass issues. President Stewart stated that the office of Safety Service would call Mr. Abbot. Council member Tollett explained that the city now has an ally with the Lorain County Public Health to assist with nuisance properties. Regarding the recycle bin, an ordinance was passed about four years ago, making the recycle bins no longer permissible in the city.

Cherie Crawford-9033 S. Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria- First Responder Joint Training Facility-Ms. Crawford explained that her concerns were regarding her property being adjacent to the FBI gun range facility. She expressed that she is very concerned with the noise and how it would affect her life. She has a small son and horses. Ms. Crawford shared that the shooting is very loud, she has experienced the noise because someone is already utilizing the property to shoot. She has many fears, that someone would get hurt and her quiet enjoyment of her property would be destroyed. President Stewart explained tonight would be the first reading, a Public Hearing will be held on June 5th. Ms. Crawford was invited to the Public Hearing for public comments. Council member Oswald shared that he has witnessed the presentation for the facility and the plan is to install tall mounds around the area.

Neil Marbrouk- 9645 Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria- First Responder Joint Training Facility- Mr. Marbrouk expressed the same concerns as Ms. Crawford in regard to his choice of living in the country for peace and quiet. Mr. Marbrouk shared that he called Elyria Police regarding the shooting and they were unaware. Mr. Marbrouk lives across from Murray Ridge School and questioned wether or not discussions were had with Murray Ridge School regarding the children with developmental disabilities and auditory issues during their recess time. expressed concerns with plans for a skid pad that he believes would certainly impact his quality of life. President Stewart suggested that Chief Pelko and Lt. Frank reach out to Mr. Marbrouk and share plans and address his concerns. President Stewart invited Mr. Marbrouk to the June 5th Public Hearing.

Carla Valles- 155 Brookvalley Dr., Elyria- Oakwood School for SOC- Ms. Valles shared that her situation is unique in that she works for Elyria City Schools as well as Save Our Children. She expressed that her day begins at 8:15AM and ends at 8:30PM everyday working for the children in the community. She expressed the need for the children to be a face and not a number. Ms. Valles stated that it makes sense to her that a facility that was built to educate children would continue to be used in their growth. Ms. Valles shared that due to covid there are children K-12 grades that are struggling. Save our Children is all about helping the children with their struggles. Ms. Valles stated over one hundred children are served by Save Our Children. The current facility no longer provides room for expansion, they have more than one hundred children in need of their help. Ms. Valles stated Oakwood would provide Save Our Children the opportunity to educate and reach more children and their families. It would provide an opportunity to increase programming. The curriculum teaches children about being positive leaders, the importance of education, and that there is no place on earth that the children don't belong. Field trips are centered around expanding the minds of the youth. Ms. Valles stated that she understands that issues exist with the Oakwood school facility, however there is no bigger investment the community can make, than in the children. Ms. Valles stated that if an investment is not made in the children, the community will die. Save Our children is working with the children to help them achieve success.

Mary Siwierka- 119 Fresno Ct., Elyria- Utility Bill Write-Offs, Chestnut Commons Traffic- Ms. Siwierka began her remarks by providing SSD Lundy with the correct notification information for high grass, being eight inches with five days to cut. SSD Lundy responded that was not correct. Ms. Siwierka explained she confirmed the information by ordinance look-up. Ms. Siwierka shared that she wanted to provide some reminders to council and Mayor Whitfield in is absence, that she is hopeful discussions regarding the traffic situation at Chestnut Commons are continuing. The Sheets gas station in under construction and increased traffic will begin. Ms. Siwierka provided a reminder regarding ARPA money. She asked that a sliver of the ARPA money be saved for railroad bridges in the downtown area, as they are still falling apart and look horrible. Ms. Siwierka inquired about utility bill write-offs. She suggested that the community receive a percentage of the write-offs each week that are transferred over to the real estate taxes. Ms. Siwierka stated that Mayor Whitfield "pontificated" about lowering water bills, however she is still paying her water bill. Ms. Siwierka stated that the write-offs would make everyone that is still paying their water bills pay more, due to non-payment and transfer to bad debt. Ms. Siwierka requested a report of council on the delinquency factor in the water and sewers funds and the amount of write-offs as a percentage of income. Law Director Deery expressed that when these matters come before committee or council, for example the resolution that is on the agenda

tonight for the collection of delinquent or inactive utility accounts to certify council and County auditor, the amounts are not written off, they are certified to the tax duplicate for collection. They have priority right behind property taxes and do not prevent the city from collecting in other matters. Law Director Deery explained they are the best shot at collecting and the city does frequently collect. Law Director Deery expressed to term the certification as a write-off would be inaccurate from a legal and financial standpoint.
