The Elyria Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission seeks to recognize the service and achievements of residents and organizations whose work reflects the teachings and example of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Dr. King dedicated his life to advancing racial, social, and economic justice through nonviolent action—an effort that uplifted not only those who faced oppression, but society as a whole.

Each year, the Commission presents awards in several categories to honor individuals and groups whose efforts embody both the concrete achievements and the enduring spirit of Dr. King's dream for our nation.

Cultural Awareness Award

Presented to an individual or organization that fosters understanding, appreciation, and respect for the rich diversity of cultures within our community. The recipient promotes dialogue, inclusion, and mutual respect through education, art, advocacy, or community engagement—reflecting Dr. King's belief in the "beloved community," where all people are valued and differences are celebrated as strengths.

Education Award

Recognizes an individual or organization that demonstrates exceptional dedication to learning, teaching, and expanding educational opportunities for all. The honoree works to inspire intellectual growth, critical thinking, and social responsibility—upholding Dr. King's conviction that "intelligence plus character—that is the goal of true education."

Health Equity Award

Recognizes outstanding efforts to promote health and wellness in underserved or marginalized communities. The recipient demonstrates leadership in addressing disparities in access, education, or outcomes—ensuring that every person has the opportunity to achieve optimal health, consistent with Dr. King's belief that "of all the forms of inequality, injustice in health is the most shocking and inhuman."

Social Justice Award

Presented to an individual or organization demonstrating exceptional commitment to advancing equity, fairness, and opportunity for all. This honoree works to challenge injustice, dismantle systemic barriers, and promote inclusive communities in the spirit of Dr. King's lifelong pursuit of justice through peaceful means.

Youth Leadership Award

Recognizes a young person (under the age of 21) who demonstrates exceptional leadership, integrity, and dedication to positive change. The recipient serves as an inspiration to peers and the community, embodying Dr. King's vision that "everybody can be great because anybody can serve.

The Elyria Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission Awards are given annually to persons or organizations whose deeds are consistent with Dr. King's teachings of non-violent social and economic change. The awards seek to recognize outstanding service and achievements by residents and organizations in areas that uniquely exemplify Dr. King's six principles of nonviolent social change. These principles are:

- 1. Cultivate a way of life for courageous people
- 2. Seek to win friendship and understanding
- 3. Endeavor to defeat injustice not people
- 4. Hold that suffering can educate and transform
- 5. Choose love instead of hate
- 6. Believe that the universe is on the side of justice

All nominees must live or work in the City of Elyria
