Mistress of Ceremony

Tiffany Tarpley is a graduate of Bowling Green State University – there she earned her Bachelor of Science in Broadcast Journalism. Before that, she completed coursework in Television Production at Lorain County Community College – there she also earned transfer credits toward her degree. Tarpley is also a graduate of Lorain Admiral King High School.

Tarpley works for WEWS ABC 5 as a Morning Anchor and Reporter, appearing in the program, “Good Morning Cleveland”. Before that, she worked at WTOL 11 in Toledo, OH as a Morning News Anchor – this was from December 2020 to December 2023. From March 2014 to December 2020, she was a Reporter, MMJ, Host, and Anchor at WKYC-TV in Cleveland.

Prior to that, Tarpley served as a Reporter and Fill-in Anchor at WDJT CBS 58 (from September 2010 to February 2014). From October 2004 to September 2010, she worked at WUPW Fox Toledo as a Weekend News Producer, Anchor, and Reporter – there she earned 2 regional Emmys and a nomination for ‘Outstanding Weekend Newscast’. Also, she held a role as an Anchor and Reporter at WOHL-TV/WLMO-TV in Lima – this was from February 2004 to October 2004, and began her career at WTOL in Toledo as a Photographer, Video Editor, and Fill-in Reporter (from May 2003 to February 2004).

Tarpley says some of her most unforgettable stories are reporting on Cleveland protests, covering Marine boot camp in South Carolina, and even interviewing her own mothers – for tips on grocery shopping. Throughout her career, she has earned several honors like 2 Emmy Awards for her weekend newscasts in Toledo. Also, she holds an Emmy Award nomination which she received for live reporting in Cleveland, OH. Tarpley was also recognized by both the Lorain Schools Alumni Association and LCCC’s Commodore Hall of Fame. She says that her approach to news is guided by 3 key values: integrity, accuracy, and authenticity.

Keynote Speaker

Rev. Thomas L. Bowen is a nationally respected faith leader, preacher, and public servant whose work bridges faith, justice, and public life. A graduate of Morehouse College, he pursued ministerial and theological studies at the University of Chicago Divinity School and has devoted his career to advancing equity, civic engagement, and community empowerment.

Rev. Bowen previously served as Senior Advisor for Faith Engagement in the White House Office of Public Engagement in the Biden-Harris Administration and has held senior leadership roles in local government and nonprofit organizations, including nearly eight years as Director of the Mayor's Office of Religious Affairs for the District of Columbia. He is the Founder and Chief Engagement Officer of EngageFaith and serves as the Earl L. Harrison Minister of Social Justice at Shiloh Baptist Church in Washington, DC.

A native of Elyria, Ohio, Rev. Bowen brings a lifelong commitment to service, shaped by the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and the prophetic tradition of the Black Church. Earlier in his career, he served on the Elyria City School Board, where he was twice elected, reflecting a deep and enduring commitment to public service and education.
